PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Richard Girard

Happy New Year everyone!

We had two great rallies this year so far - if you count the New Year's Rally that starts in one year and ends in the next! Jan and I enjoyed visiting with all of the members who were able to attend these events!

The next rally is in April, and will be a joint rally with



the Arizona Unit. It will be held at Roosevelt Lake, which is north and east of Phoenix. This rally was originally to be held at Roper Lake State Park in southern Arizona, but had to be moved because of funding issues with the park system.

Arizona State Parks have been forced to close over half of the parks because the state legislature took away over 8 million dollars that the parks operate with. This is disastrous for clubs like ours that use these facilities for our rallies! More information about these closures can be found here:

I have sent numerous letters to my elected officials stating our concern over the loss of these great facilities; I urge you to contact your legislators too!

There has been much concern about the financial condition of the WBCCI as well. The economic collapse in our country has affected everyone, and the club is no exception. The WBCCI has made some adjustment to try and compensate for its budget shortfall, and one of those adjustments is a \$10 dues increase that will take effect in 2011. Personally, I am opposed to this increase, and will be lobbying to try and get it reversed at the International Rally this summer in Gillette, WY.

There were also cuts made to the travel expenses of all International and Regional WBCCI Officers. There are several other items that are currently being examined that when implemented, will significantly reduce the operating costs of the Club. All of that aside, this year is going to be another great one for the Four Corners Unit! **Ken Johansen** is currently taking reservations for the Restoration Rally in June, and the Balloon Fiesta Rally in October. These are both premier events for our unit - our sincere thanks to Ken!

We have several other rallies planned this year, but could always use another excuse to hitch up the trailer and get out of town! If you have an idea for a rally, let me know! Until then, travel safe, and we'll see you 'round the campfire.



RALLY REPORT: DEAD HORSE 4 by Richard Girard



RALLY RECIPES WE LOVE!

Goat Cheese Enchiladas by Julianne Campbell (from Bobby Flay recipe) served at New Year's Rally chili pepper potluck

Ingredients:

- 12 blue corn tortillas
- Red Chile-Tomato Sauce, recipe follows
- Goat Cheese Filling, recipe follows
- 8 ounces Monterey jack, grated
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro leaves
- Sour cream, for garnish
- Chopped green onions, for garnish

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
- 2. Dip tortillas in chile sauce to lightly coat both sides. Spoon about 2 tablespoons of the goat cheese filling on each tortilla and roll up. (To help prevent the tortillas from splitting, put them in the microwave for 20-30 seconds. They become more pliable.)
- 3. Spread 1/2 cup of the tomato-chile sauce into a medium, deep casserole dish. Arrange rolled tortillas in the casserole so they fit snugly. Repeat with remaining tortillas.
- 4. Pour 1 1/2 cups of the sauce over the enchiladas and top with the grated cheese.
- 5. Bake for 20 to 30 minutes or until the enchiladas are heated through. Remove from the oven and sprinkle with chopped cilantro. Garnish with sour cream and green onions.

Ingredients:

- 3 ancho chiles
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 large red onion, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 1 tablespoon dried Mexican oregano
- 1 cup dry white wine
- 2 (16-ounce) cans plum tomatoes, pureed
- 3 cups homemade chicken or vegetable stock
- 1 to 2 tablespoons honey
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Red Chile-Tomato Sauce

Directions:

- 1. Bring 2 cups of water to a boil in a small saucepan.
 Add chiles, remove from heat and let sit for 30
- 2. Remove stems and seeds, then place in food processor with 1/4 cup of the soaking liquid and puree until smooth.
- 3. Heat oil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Add onion and cook until soft.
- 4. Add garlic and cook for 1 minute.
- 5. Add cumin and oregano and cook for 1 minute.
- 6. Add ancho puree and cook for 2 to 3 minutes.
- 7. Add wine, pureed tomatoes, and stock and cook for 25 to 30 minutes or until slightly thickened.
- 8. Season with honey, salt, and pepper, to taste. For a chunkier sauce, leave as is. For a smoother sauce, puree in batches in a blender or food processor. Keep warm until ready to serve.

Goat Cheese Filling

Ingredients:

- 1 1/4 pounds goat cheese
- 3 cloves garlic, coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup freshly grated cotija cheese
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup finely chopped cilantro leaves

Directions:

- 1. Place goat cheese, garlic, cotija, and lime juice in a food processor and process until smooth.
- 2. Season with salt and pepper and fold in the cilantro.


APRIL 15 - 18

ROOSEVELT LAKE RALLY - A JOINT VENTURE OF THE AZ UNIT & THE 4CU SPRING IN THE DESERT SOUTHWEST!

Join us for this Spring rally, located roughly 80 miles northeast of Phoenix in the Salt River Valley. We will gather at the Grapevine Campground, Greeb Loop. There will be plenty of time for outdoor activities and games under the pavilion. Bring binoculars for wildlife viewing and cameras for great pictures. We are looking forward to exploring this part of our state and enjoying the beautiful scenery it has to offer.

Roosevelt Lake, the oldest artificial reservoir in Arizona, is located in the Tonto National Forest which embraces almost 3 million acres of rugged and spectacularly beautiful country, ranging from Saguaro cactus-studded desert to pine-forested mountains beneath the Mogollon Rim. We'll have opportunity for such activities as fishing, hiking, kayaking, geocaching, and wildlife viewing.

The camping is dry and you will need to come with a full tank of drinking water and empty black and gray tanks! Bring food for Happy Hours, and for some this may be their evening meal. We'll probably have one potluck. We will plan to join together to eat our meals.

DIRECTIONS:

- From North Phoenix, Mesa and Scottsdale: Take Beeline Highway (Highway 87) north to Highway 188. Take 188 south for about 40 miles passing through Jake's Corner and Punkin Center to Lake Roosevelt. The route is all paved.
- From Globe Arizona: Take Highway 188 for about 30 miles north of Globe.
- The third way to get to Roosevelt Lake, the Apache Trail route, is not recommended. ApacheTrail is a winding, narrow road with steep dropoffs! Do not drive the Apache Trail to get to Roosevelt Lake unless it is something you really want to do!
