

The Four Corners Unit is a chartered unit of the Wally Byam Caravan Club, Int'l. all original content copyright © Four Corners Unit of New Mexico, all rights reserved. RED ROCK PARK, with elevation from 6600 to 7000 feet and encompassing 640 acres, has a large campground equipped with electric and water hookups, picnic areas, restrooms and showers. The spectacular red cliffs which frame the Park on three sides began formation 205 million years ago, during the Mesozoic era, sometimes referred to as the Age of the Dinosaurs. Several archeological sites in the Park record the presence of the Anasazi, a prehistoric farming culture which developed and persisted in the area from 300 to 1200 AD. From 1700 to the present, the region has been sparsely inhabited by the Navajo Indians.

Red Rock Park, situated in Indian Country, is the gateway to Zuni, one of the Seven Cites of Cibola sought by Coronado and the Conquistadors; Acoma, the sky city, one of the oldest inhabited cities in the United States; Old Laguna Pueblo and its Spanish church; the Hopi Reservation; and the Navajo and El Morro are among the National Monuments within a two hour drive from Red Rock Park. Petrified Forest National Park, the Ice Caves beneath Lava Badlands with temperatures of 31 degrees year round, the incomparable views of the badland formations known as the Painted Desert are all natural wonders that shouldn't be missed when exploring the Gallup area.

PARKING RESERVATIONS

Parking is \$15.00 per night with water and electric. (This is separate from the Rally Fee and paid directly to the park.) Dump sites are available within the park.

You will need to make your own reservations by calling Red Rock Park at 505 722-3839.

Restrooms and showers are available. To park nearby the restrooms or handicap, make your request known when making your reservations.



53RD WBCCI INTERNATIONAL RALLY by Richard Girard



On the morning of the 17th of June, Jan and I hit the road to Gillette, Wyoming to attend the 53rd WBCCI International Rally. Three and a half days later we arrived at Cam-Plex rally site. After spending a night in the "Bull Pen", we were parked in the Vintage Section of the largest campground I have ever seen - it eventually was filled with over 600 Airstreams. All the sites

were on grass with full hookups, and it was truly a City of Aluminum!



There were two other locations for parking, which brought the total number of Airstreams to well over 700. We attended several social events and a training session before the rally officially began, and even got to spend a day at Devils Tower National Monument.

Once the rally began there were meetings, seminars, shopping at the vendor area, and nightly entertainment to keep us busy. As your President, I carried the Unit Flag in the opening ceremony, and represented the FCU at the annual Delegates Meeting. I was also the presenter at a seminar where I demonstrated how to use the Internet to promote rallies and communicate with members.



At the Region Luncheon I was supposed to be installed as the Region 11 2nd Vice President, but because of the resignation of the current 2nd VP, Will Sander, I was installed as the Region 11 1st VP by the 2009/2010 International Secretary Anne Werth (who is also a member of the New Mexico Unit). One very positive thing that came out of the IBT Meeting is that the club has a balanced budget for the next fiscal year. Also, a brand new unit in Northern Ohio was approved, so 4CU is no longer the newest unit in the club!

On the second of July we left the rally a couple of days early; I had to get back to my job in Phoenix after the 4th. But we truly hated to leave! In the almost 3 weeks that we were gone, we made many new friends and visited several new places. It was a great trip!

Next year we will be traveling to De Quoin, Illinois to attend the 54th International Rally - why not make plans to attend; we'd love to see you there!



BUILDING THE SLATE OF OFFICERS FOR 2011 by Terry Rich

The Nominating Committee is in the process of forming a slate of officers for the Four Corners Unit of New Mexico for 2011.

- Louis Hall, currently 1st Vice President, has agreed to be on the slate for the position of President.
- **Howard Efner, currently Treasurer,** has agreed to be on the slate for the position of Treasurer.
- **Several existing officers** have agreed to be on the slate for Trustee positions. (The Unit is required to have a minimum of **2** Trustees, but may have more.)

We are seeking members to be on the slate for the positions of

- **1st Vice President**
 - **2nd Vice President**
- Corresponding/Recording Secretary (a combined position) §

This is an opportunity for interested parties to step up and serve the Unit and to be more involved in its development and direction. If you are interested in serving in one of these capacities, or if you would like to **be placed on the ballot for an existing** board position, please contact a member of the Nominating Committee at the email addresses below no later than **1 August**, **2010**. Once a slate is completed, we will present the slate of officers to the members and the election of 2011 officers will be held.

Please note that the unit handles most of its business online, but participation at rallies is also preferred.

So that you are aware of what the responsibility of each position entails, following is Article V of the Four Corners Unit of New Mexico's By-Laws, which lays out those duties:

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Sec. 1 The President shall:

- Preside at all meetings of the Unit and Executive Board.
- Enforce the Constitution and Bylaws.
- Appoint all standing committees
- Have such powers and duties as normally pertain to the principal executive officer.

Sec. 2 The 1st Vice President shall:

- Attend all business meetings of the Unit and the Executive Board.
- Shall assist the President.
- Assume the duties of the President in the President's absence.

Sec. 3 The 2nd Vice President shall:

- Attend all business meetings of the unit and the Executive Board.
- Assist the President and the First Vice President.
- Assume the duties of the First Vice President in the absence of said officer.
- Assume the duties of the President in the case of the absence of the President and the First Vice President.
- Perform the duties as assigned by the Executive Board.

Sec. 4 The Corresponding Secretary shall:

- Issue notices of all meetings of the Unit and the Executive Board as prescribed in Article VI, Sections 1 and 2 and Article VIII, Section 2 of the Constitution and ARTICLE XI, Sec.1 of the Bylaws.
- Prepare an agenda of pending business for use by the presiding officer at each

meeting.

• Coordinate with the Treasurer to maintain an accurate roster of paid-up members of the Unit.

(Ed. Note: In addition, the Corresponding Secretary communicates rally details to the Blue Beret magazine, and assists with national, regional, and unit elections.)

Sec. 5 The Recording Secretary shall:

- Record and preserve the minutes of all official meetings of the Unit and the Executive Board, and mail copies to the members of the Executive Board not more than fifteen days following each meeting.
- Record the attendance of the officers at each meeting and advise the presiding officer if a quorum is present.

Sec. 6 The Treasurer shall:

- Maintain the financial records of the Unit and receive all monies, as prescribed in International Bylaws, Article IV, Sec. 11A, and promptly deposit them in the bank previously chosen by the Executive Board.
- Notify members of expiration of dues, issue receipts for dues paid, and maintain an up-to-date roster of paid-up members. Changes to this roster shall be shared with the Corresponding Secretary, the Newsletter Editor, and the Membership Chairman. In addition, the Membership Chairman shall be notified of all members who have not paid their dues by October 15th in order that the membership chairman might assist the Treasurer in contacting those members to collect their dues prior to November 1st.
- Submit a full written report of finances to the Executive Board at each meeting. Each year the books and accounts will be audited by a committee selected by the incoming President. Before retirement, all books, monies and property of the Unit shall be delivered promptly to the incoming Treasurer.

Sec. 7 The duties of the Trustees (or Directors) shall be:

- To attend all meetings of the Unit and the Executive Board.
- To accept special assignments as directed by the President. Additional duties may be to chair or be members of committees.

Arizona State Parks Update

Good news! 23 Arizona State Parks will stay open! The Arizona State Parks Board voted on May 19 to keep five more State Parks from closing on June 3 by directing Executive Director Renee Bahl to sign unique management and financial agreements with rural communities to keep each one open.

"The State Parks Board, a volunteer group of seven members, has voted in the last three months to negotiate with counties, cities and parks friends groups to fund a total of 23 State Parks to be open into the next fiscal year. The real key now is that we need every Arizonan to use their State Parks as often as possible," said Bahl. "We want the public to know that the Board and staff are focusing on keeping State Parks open because the fiscal impact and loss of jobs from closed parks would be devastating to these rural towns and we believe every Arizonan deserves a robust State Park system."

Here are some of the highlights of the community efforts: Bashas' Family of Stores (130) raised \$20,000, Dasani Water raised \$5,000 for recycling programs, Apache Junction businesses raised \$26,000 (Lost Dutchman), Tubac Historical Society raised \$35,000 (Tubac Presidio), Friends of Tonto raised \$8,000 (Tonto Nat. Bridge), Wickenburg/Salome raised \$30,000 (Alamo), Riordan Action Alliance raised \$40,000 (Riordan Mansion), **the City of Eloy has raised \$20,000 (Picacho Peak)**, Benefactors of Red Rock State Park have raised \$60,000, Friends of Oracle State Park have raised \$50,000 and Yuma raised \$70,000 (Territorial Prison). The Arizona Game and Fish Department helped Graham County rescue Roper Lake State Park and Apache County will keep Lyman Lake open this summer. Arizona Highways Magazine has already sold more than 100 magazine subscriptions to support State Parks and the increased tourism these subscriptions will generate will help increase park revenues.


