



## Are You a Member of [www.airforums.com](http://www.airforums.com)?



Many 4CU members are also members of the largest online Airstream community available, [www.Airforums.com](http://www.Airforums.com). For those of us who are not familiar with the Airforums, consider joining it to take advantage of the wealth of information, the fun of being part of a large online Airstream community, and the potential friendships to be made.

It is not necessary to become a registered member of the Airforums in order to research and find available information, but one must be a registered member in order to post questions and fully participate in discussions and the exchange of ideas and information. Membership in the Airforums is easy . . . and it is FREE. You simply create a profile, sharing as much or as little information about yourself as you wish, and create a name that will appear with your posts. (Those wishing to become "Supporting Members" with a \$20 contribution to the Forums will enjoy an "enhanced account" - with a larger avatar, more photo upload space, more Personal Message (PM) space and more.) The name you create for yourself is how other members of the Airforums will know you.

### Why is the Airforums Useful for 4CU Members?

One of the features of the Airforums is the ability to create private areas for groups and clubs. The 4CU has established a private area of the Airforums where members of the 4CU (Full Members, Honoraries, and Affiliates) can communicate and post items of interest to fellow 4CU members, such as upcoming rallies, etc. Membership in the 4CU Private Area is available only to members of the 4CU, and discussion threads created within the 4CU Section are visible only to those who have gained access to the 4CU Private Area.

**Interested parties must request access to the 4CU Private Area.** Currently, we have fewer than half of 4CU members participating in the Airforums' 4CU Private Area.

### Here's how you Gain Access to the Private 4CU Area on the Airforums:

1. First, you must be a registered member of the Airforums AND a Full, Honorary, or Affiliate Member of the 4CU.
2. Click on "User CP" (User Control Panel) in the blue navigation banner at the top of each page of the Airforums.



3. You will be directed to your personal User Control Panel . . . this is where you determine settings for your account. On the left side of the page, find the "Networking" section and click on "Group Memberships".



4. You will be taken to a page showing user groups that are available to join. "WBCCI #004 - Four Corners Unit" will appear in the list of available user groups. (If you are already a member of the 4CU User Group, 4CU will be shown below, in the list of groups you already belong to.)
5. In the list of groups available to join, find "WBCCI #004 - Four Corners Unit" and check the "Join Group" circle to the right . . . then click the "Join Group" button at the bottom of that section.
6. You will then see a dialogue box where you type your request for access to the 4CU private section. Be sure to include your real name in case we don't recognize your Airforums name. Then click "Send Request."

Terry Rich will receive notification of your request via the Airforums. He'll verify 4CU membership and arrange access to the private area. It's that simple!

You will automatically "see" threads created in the 4CU Private Area, and new posts made to existing threads, just as you see new threads and posts in any of the public areas. You may "unjoin" any group you have membership in at any time by returning to the "Groups Membership" page, selecting the group you want to leave at the bottom, and clicking "Leave Group".

Please let Terry Rich know if you have any questions or need a clarification of the process, and we hope to see you joining the Airforums 4CU Private Area soon! You may also contact an Airforums Moderator for help navigating the site.

## RALLY REPORT: VINTAGE RESTORATION RALLY - ALBUQUERQUE, NM

Each year vintage Airstream enthusiasts gather from all over the United States for the annual Vintage Restoration Rally held in Albuquerque, NM. It is a Vintage Airstream Club event sponsored by the Four Corners Unit, WBCCI. This year was the sixth annual and the rally is more of a conference, seminar, or university of vintage Airstream restoration. Each year this rally gets better and better. It is the only rally in the county whose sole purpose is to teach Airstream restoration skills taught by professionals - folks who do these things for a living.

This year's rally featured Uwe Salwender, president of Area 63 Productions from Orange, CA; Kip Eagan, an aircraft sheet metal mechanic; Lew Farber, owner of Master Tech RV in Hood River, OR; and Luke Bernander, who owns an Airstream restoration shop in Colorado. These folks are masters at what they do and we were very fortunate to have them demonstrate the proper way of repairing Airstreams!

The rally was pretty much non-stop from Thursday night to mid-day on Sunday - with back-to-back seminars on skin replacement, riveting, electric basics, polishing, window rebuilding and replacement, upholstery, and cabinet making. Not only did you get to see the proper way to handle various projects, we actually put tools in your hands to practice these skills should you desire that opportunity.

A very popular session this year was Vintage Airstream Valuation taught by Jim Polk. Mr. Polk is one of the few in the country who is certified to do valuations for insurance companies and the Internal Revenue Service. Jim talked about insurance for our vintage units as well as discussed the current market for vintage Airstreams - a very interesting and informative talk.

By the time Sunday noon rolled around, most attendees were in information overload! There is so much to absorb - which is why we have folks who come back year after year. I've heard many say if nothing else they walk away knowing what they can tackle themselves, and what skills should be hired out to the professionals.

Sunday afternoon was reserved for our presenters to walk around to various units and inspect restoration progress and give first hand advice on how to proceed on an individual basis - a much-appreciated time, as owners can have these pros look at their individual projects. Also during that time Mr. Polk was available for valuations of vintage units at a very reasonable fee.

Another session we were the first to include is our Tech Hour - this is where the entire panel of experts answered specific questions, gave advice or clarified what was taught in the various classes.

Saturday evening we enjoyed a catered dinner, because we figured that by then everyone was somewhat spent from learning, and didn't want to fix dinner. From everything we can tell this rally was most definitely a winner - year after year we get incredible feedback on the amount of learning attendees receive, and each year we try to improve it a bit and always have something new to teach, so that anyone who has attended before has something new to look forward to! The attendees come from all over the US for this rally - you do not need to have an Airstream with you; several fly in and stay in local hotels.

This is a serious event for anyone who owns a vintage Airstream, is serious about restoring a Vintage Airstream the proper way, or just wants to know how their coach is put together. We look forward to seeing everyone in Albuquerque next Spring for the next Vintage Restoration Rally! - *Ken J*

## RALLY REPORT: BALLOON FIESTA RALLY - ALBUQUERQUE, NM

**B**alloon Fiesta! Those words say it all! It's a weekend of balloons and good times. This year was certainly no exception. A rally that started with 20 Airstreams six years ago has grown to 117 this year and we expect 200 next year. This makes this Four Corners Rally one of the largest in the nation! Besides the International Rally there is only one other rally that we are aware of that is larger, but not by much.

People from all over the world come to this event as it is one of the few balloon events where you can walk right up to the balloons and watch them set up and take off - you can actually talk to the pilots. The launch field is 54 football fields in size and up to 700 balloons take off during the mass ascension each morning. This balloon event is the largest in the world and is the most photographed event on the planet. It is the largest international event held in the U.S. About 800,000 folks visit the Albuquerque Balloon Fiesta each year.

So why does this event attract so many balloonists? Well, besides the great weather that Albuquerque enjoys the first week of October - it's all about the "box". The "Albuquerque Box" as it's called, allows the balloons to fly in one direction at a given altitude and the opposite direction at a different altitude. This allows the balloons to stay fairly close to the field and provides excellent viewing by those on the ground.

Each morning the excitement begins about 5 AM - helicopters start rotating the field followed by the hiss of the first balloon that goes up to check the conditions. Assuming all is well, by 7AM or so, balloons are inflated and the mass ascension begins - hundreds of balloons fill the air - all different colors, shapes and sizes - cameras are clicking like crazy to capture it all. "Special Shape" balloons are a real treat for all - there are stage coaches, witches, cows, bees, bottles; you name it, if you can imagine it, it probably can be made. We have heard that we should invest in a Silver Airstream to send up into the sky!

We, in our comfortable Airstreams, roll out of our beds with coffee in hand and many of us in PJs to watch this event - you don't have to move more than three feet from your trailer to catch all the action! However, if you really want to get in on the action, a short walk onto the field is all you need to do - all the while watching what seems to be the endless line of cars as they wait to get into the Fiesta grounds. This is one of those times we know how lucky we are to have our little home with us.

Once the balloons are all landed - by about 9 AM or so, it's time for rest and relaxation, visiting with old friends that we only see each year at the event, or making new ones that will last a lifetime. There is lots of time for seeing the sights around town if you desire. On the field there is chainsaw carving and on Sunday a nice car show with lots of old cars. There is also the annual "tour de balloon fiesta" bike ride that follows the many bike paths that go all over the city of Albuquerque.

Then there's the food! Dozens of vendors are on the grounds, each competing for the best burrito and other great treats - and lots of trinkets to take home. Then at 5 PM each day we gather for an informal Happy Hour with announcements and fellowship. Sunday night is the grand potluck! Imagine a potluck for over 200 people! The spread is incredible! This is a time where we also show our appreciation to the parking folks who work so hard to get us set up and comfortable.

So who are we that attend this great event? We are Airstreamers from all over the US and Canada - we even had one attendee from Australia. We come alone, we travel in groups, we travel with our units - it's amazing to see 117 names on a piece of paper, but to see 117 shiny trailers lined up is truly amazing!

If you have been to this rally before, you know exactly what I'm talking about. If you have not, we suggest you sign up early for this great event, as we do fill up pretty quick and this is a must for your rally Bucket List! It is truly a great event for the whole family - both young and old! We look forward to seeing you at next year's Balloon Fiesta! Stay tuned and watch for an announcement in late January with details! - *Ken, Suzanne, Jim & Lynda*

A later trip coincided with 4CU's Dead Horse 5 Rally in 2011. We just intended to introduce ourselves and ask a few questions. ## A Christmas Getaway to Lost Dutchman State Park with a Finish at the 4CU New Year's Rally Travel Log & Photos by Terry Rich & Greg Schmuker



The last several years we have been leaving town for the holidays, with trips that encompass both Christmas and New Year's. We appreciate our friends understanding that our being away over the holidays is no reflection on how we feel about them . . . and it's actually kinda nice to spend Christmas doing something completely "un-Christmas." We made our 2008 Holiday Trip to the San Diego area, where we met our Airstream friends Larry & Bill from San Diego for a day, then hooked up with them later together with several other Airstreamers for an impromptu campout at Palm Canyon Campground in the [Anza-Borrego Desert State Park](#) near Borrego Springs, CA. It was a great trip for the most part, considering the unusually poor weather we experienced in the San Diego area that year - rain all day Christmas Day while at [Dos Picos County Park](#), nearly got caught in a snow storm in the mountains above San Diego, and ended up camping in a terribly snow-damaged [William Heise County Park](#) . . . but finally warmed up when we hit the desert for New Year's.

But for 2009 we decided not to go to the San Diego area. The weather being risky, we'd save that trip for a warmer time of the year. We decided to stay closer to home, save fuel costs, and explore some of the camping opportunities in the metro Phoenix area in the Valley of the Sun . . . then head back to Picacho Peak State Park for the Four Corners Unit New Year's Rally.

Our first destination for the Christmas leg of our trip was [Lost Dutchman State Park](#) about 5 miles NE of Apache Junction, AZ on the Apache Trail, about 40 miles east of Phoenix. We've known about Lost Dutchman for some time and we have driven through the park back when we had our small motor home, but we had never camped there . . . mostly because there were no hookups (at that time), so it was dry camping. Now that we are generator-equipped that is not such an issue, and the park has since added electric/water sites to the loops.



Lost Dutchman is named after the fabled Lost Dutchman Gold Mine. Hiking trails lead from the park into the Superstition Mountain Wilderness and surrounding Tonto National Forest. Depending on the year's rainfall, it's a favorite desert wildflower destination in the spring and you can spot coyote, javelina and jackrabbit everywhere. There are 70 camping campsites with picnic tables and grills. When we started going there, it was all dry camping, but some sites now have electric and water hookups. The park has a dump station, restrooms, showers, group use areas and a visitor center.

The most striking thing about the park is its location at the foot of the western escarpment of the Superstition Mountains. The park is dominated by the rugged mountains, which rise abruptly and dramatically from the desert and the face of the vertical cliffs change character as the light of the day changes. It's difficult to take your eyes off the mountains . . . they are beautiful and ever changing. Because the temperatures in the area is pretty warm in the summer (actually it's not just "warm". . . it's hot) the best time to camp there is late fall, winter and early spring.

We packed up the Bambi and truck and left for Lost Dutchman on Tuesday, 22 December. We drove north from Tucson on our regular route to the "back door" of the Phoenix Metro area . . . north on Route 79 through Florence to Highway 60, then west into Apache Junction and north of Apache Trail. It's an easy trip of only about 110 miles from Tucson. We checked in mid-afternoon and drove through the park a few times on different interior roads to familiarize ourselves with the layout. There are sites to accommodate any size rig, really . . . some of them are pull-throughs and some are back-ins. We decided to take a dry camping site on a road that had smallish back-in sites with lots of privacy because of the dense desert vegetation. And right across from the site we chose was a nice, shiny vintage Airstream (who turned out to be Jim & Marcy Gray, whom we befriended and

who are now members of the 4CU! Hmmm.) We thought we'd fit into that "neighborhood" nicely! Our site choice was very nice . . . we had a great view of the Superstitions from the panoramic window at the front of the Bambi, and we could sit on our patio and take it all in. The site had a paved pad for the trailer and a tent area of course sand, all edged with rocks. Very pleasant. It was so clean we didn't even put a rug down! And the Girls loved it. They could dig their shallow little holes and lie in the cool sand all they wanted to . . . and wouldn't get that dirty. And that's just what they did as we unpacked the truck and set up camp. Everyone was in a good mood and happy to be there.




