"Neither snow, nor rain, nor heat, nor gloom of night stays these courageous couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds" ... and it won't stop the Four Corners Unit (4CU) either!

Once again, it was time for the legendary 8th Annual New Year's Airstream Rally organized by the Four Corners Unit of Wally Byam Caravan Club International (WBCCI)! The rally is held at Picacho Peak State Park just north of Tucson, AZ! The Airstreams began to arrive on Tuesday and would be there until Sunday — definitely taking advantage of a midweek holiday!

For some people, six days of reading a book, hiking the mountains, or simply visiting with friends they haven't seen in a few months or longer can be a blessing. But for me, it was a huge challenge — I can't sit still for that long without some type of project. I could mountain bike with my husband, Alan, for one day, but for five? I knew I could always sew. Then I thought. "Maybe someone else would want to sew, too — not a big project, just something small – maybe even something for charity!"

I mentioned it to **Diane Moore**, a fellow 4CU Airstreamer, and quilter, and she appointed me chairperson with "Go, Girl, Go!" Our Membership Chair, **Terry Rich**, suggested that I write up a project proposal and submit it to the 4CU Board to gain their support. (He knew they would love the idea ... and they did!) The Board unanimously responded with enthusiasm. And to expedite planning, they left the choice of charity up to me.

"Quilts For Kids" (QFK) was in the forefront of my mind. I had connected with the organization over the past 5 years but I had a personal connection to them as well. At 6 weeks old, my son spent a week at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, one of QFK recipient hospitals. We were blessed to take home our healthy baby, but some families weren't so lucky ... and had to spend much more time there than we did. QFK was the right choice!

With the 4CU Board on board, planning for the project began immediately. What quilt patterns? How many would really sew? How many would support us with fabric donations? After a mass emailing to the members and a beautiful announcement in our Newsletter, emails began arriving from members ... who were all so excited about this event!

"I don't sew ... but how can I help?"

"My daughter sews and has a lot of fabric, but she is in Oregon; what can I bring?"

"What should I buy with my 50% off coupon from Joann's?"

"I found batting on sale! How much do we need?"

The comments went on and on! So, I began the preparation.

After consulting the Quilt for Kids Web site, I chose a few patterns and shared them to the 4CU members for review. Emails continued ... some even asked if they could start cutting before the event! I was overwhelmed. It was phenomenal.

A few weeks later, while visiting family in Philadelphia I decided to stop by the Quilts for Kids Headquarters and talk to them about the project. What a visit we had! I had the genuine pleasure of meeting **Nancy** and the rest of the staff and even a few volunteer sewists who come often to the fully equipped studio to sew for the kids. Nancy showed me around and then we talked with everyone about the upcoming Airstream rally weekend. Best of all, Nancy gave me some kits to bring back. They were as excited as I was! Five kits — I hope we could get them done!

When we got back to Arizona, I gathered irons, sewing machines, thread, notions and extension cords together. I even took a weekend to cut up more kits from my donated fabric. So we were set and everything was ready. The only variable was the weather. December/January in Arizona can go either way but our fingers were crossed!

When **Alan** and I arrived at the rally on Tuesday, the sun was shining and there was a small bite in the air. We settled in and got my machine and his bike out. The forecast predicted that the sun wouldn't last. The quilting event was scheduled to begin on Thursday, but I wanted to take advantage of the sun before it left, figuring I would get a head start on one quilt top before the others arrived.

As predicted, the rain began overnight and at dawn gray clouds began their quick approach. Even though the rain had started and the temperature was dropping, I bundled up, dodged the rain and got the supplies to the ramada. I decided to sew even in the rain ... and though it was cold and rainy others joined in, too! We had about 3 sewing machines set up ... but more importantly, everyone was coming over to find how they could help.

The next thing we knew, tarps were getting hung around the ramada sides to create more shelter. We had only limited communal electricity in the ramadas. We had tried to have a few electric heaters at our feet, but we blew the breaker so the park ranger had to come by and reset it! Electricity was a challenge, but after a few set backs, we got it together! Then folks brought in propane tanks with big gas heaters to save the day.

Spirits high and staying warm, we were a true community coming together for the kids. People at four machines and two irons – with heavy-duty extension cords between the ramadas kept everything powered up. Everyone was coming to watch and stay with us ... and next thing you know, we had fresh-baked-in-the-trailer brownies, cookies and cranberry bread! The makeshift sewing room became the place to hang out!! Even with the weather, it was a wonderful success and we got five quilt tops done!

By Thursday, we had a full house — 6 machines, 2 irons, a glue basting area and more donations! We had music, lunch breaks and it was an amazing day that ended in twelve completed quilt tops! The heat was still going, but it was the warmth of heart that kept us together!

On Friday, the weather was still a bit nasty but the sun had come out. A few attendees left the rally in search of warmer temperatures, but we still had a contingent of sewists and supporters remaining! Due to scheduling, we only had 2 hours to finish up, so we made sure each quilt top started was completed. I even had time to share some improvisational quilting with the group. And, with the help of a spunky four-year-old, we made two more tops while I told her about the destination of the Quilts for Kids. She couldn't pick out the fabrics for "her" quilt fast enough! We got 14 quilt tops done! During the afternoon, everyone was together and we had the opportunity to show the Quilts for Kids quilt tops, thank everyone for their support, and applaud the 4CU for a hugely successful charity event to kick off 2015!

Finally, on Saturday, people were winding down their weekend and beginning to head out. The machines didn't come out, but the sun did and coats were shed with the better weather! We took this opportunity to sort through the bag of donated fabrics and made a few more quilt kits modeled after the kits directly from Quilts for Kids Headquarters.

I cannot tell you how wonderful this weekend was for everyone. A number of truisms came to mind during the rally ... "Many hands make light work".... "Teach a man to fish..." "Pay it forward..." The 4CU can be proud of this effort of giving from the heart. Thank you all!

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I want to thank all the wonderful staff at Quilt for Kids Headquarters in Fairless Hills, PA for guiding me through this event. It would have been impossible without you all. Your support and enthusiasm for this endeavor will carry us through the next. Everyone is looking forward to doing this again! Much love to you and much love for the kids!

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





Member Spotlight: "Huge Storm" . . . "Tornado" . . . "Roof Blew Off" . . . "Your Airstream" by Don & Marilyn Sluyk

Those were the words I heard in my voice mail at the Chicago airport when returning from Germany last June, along with "please call!"

Upon calling while still in the airport, the same words were repeated with not much more detail - even after repeated questions. Between the airport noise, me being hard of hearing and 71, along with my friend being over 80, I figured it was the end of my 1960 Tradewind Airstream. I told him I would come up to Flagstaff from Phoenix as soon as we got home.

About three years ago a tornado went through Belmont, which is about 20 miles west of Flagstaff. It caused several semi trucks and railroad cars to be overturned, plus extensive damage to Camping World and many RVs. Camping World was closed for about a year due to the damage.

For two days and nights I struggled with worrying thoughts running through my head -

• "How could an Airstream's roof be torn off? Especially a vintage airstream with every rivet ½" to 1" apart ... ?"

• "It could be blown over, but blown apart?"

• "They made airplanes with the same rivets and aluminum to withstand more wind and forces than any storm!"

• "If it also rained, would everything inside also be destroyed?"

• "I will have to write to Airstream to find out how this could happen. Were there defects with 1960 Tradewinds?"

Upon arriving home, there was my Tradewind . . . just as perfect and untouched as ever!

The "rest of the story" was finally made clear. My friend lives in a 50 year-old mobile home trailer in between two permanent buildings, all made into a house and garage. The roof to *his* trailer was peeled back about 30 feet by the storm, and he had called me to ask if they could stay in our Airstream while rebuilding!

My faith and pride in Airstreams was restored!

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

Our Latest Membership Numbers:

On 1 January 2015 — after removing the handful of members who did not renew from the roster — we had 167 Full Member Rigs + 83 Affiliates for a total of 250 Member Rigs. Even with this normal attrition, we started 2015 better than 2014. At the same point in 2014, we had 121 Full Members and 91 Affiliates for a total of 219. That's a net gain of 39 Full Members with a net loss of 11 Affiliates for 2015.

And SINCE 1 January 2015, we have welcomed several more new members! As of this reporting we have 175 Full Member Rigs and 83 Affiliate Rigs for a total of 258 Member Rigs!

It's because of <u>you</u> that the 4CU remains one of the top WBCCI units in growth and is known for its great gatherings and its welcoming membership. You have all had a hand in making the unit what it is.

Help the 4CU Continue to Grow!

When we camp there are often opportunities to share our good times in the 4CU with other Airstreamers we meet along the way. All members are part of the membership effort ... why not print some 4CU 2015 Member Applications (see the last page of the Newsletter) and keep a supply in your rig ... or keep a copy on your laptop to email to folks you meet while camping! 

Lake Pleasant Maricopa County Regional Park February 2009 Travel Log & Photos by Terry Rich & Greg Schmuker

Preface: We have been to Lake Pleasant several times — with friends, on our own, and for 4CU rallies ... in fact, we've camped there as recently as last month on our way home to Tucson after the Lo Lo Mai Rally... but our first visit sticks in our minds because it was a brand new experience for us... so we relate here our first visit in February of 2009:



Our 4CU (at the time) friend **Sandy** from Salt Lake City used to travel to Arizona for a couple of months each year with her two Samoyeds, **Cody** and **Tasha**. We met Sandy in April 2008 when we were at **Dead Horse Ranch State Park**. She joined us at the **Dead Horse 3 Rally in 2009**. Sandy had some personal business to take care of in Phoenix, so when the rally ended we decided to extend the trip south with Sandy and go to **Cave Creek Regional Park** with her, about 7 miles east of I-17 just north of Metro Phoenix, north off Carefree Highway (*and the site of the upcoming Friday the 13th Rally*).

We were our own mini-caravan of two Airstreams on our way to Cave Creek, which was fun. Several folks waived a thumbs up to us as we headed south on I-17. We got to Cave Creek without any problem, but alas, when we got there, we learned that they were full to overflowing with a waiting list in the overflow area 7 or 8 units deep. None of us really wanted to stay there because we had no guarantee of how many days it would be before we'd be able to get in.

The ranger suggested Lake Pleasant Regional Park, another park in the Maricopa County Regional Park system, which is about 11 miles west of I-17 north off Carefree Highway, so it was not a long trip to get there from Cave Creek. The ranger called Lake Pleasant for us and they had electric sites available! So we drove through the Cave Creek grounds to check it out for future reference, before we hustled on over to Lake Pleasant. Cave Creek was a really nice place ... plush feeling desert vegetation, nice sites and pleasant atmosphere. (*To this day we have not stayed at Cave Creek, so we are very much looking forward to the rally there later this month.*)

We had known about Lake Pleasant but we'd never really considered going there because it's a big boating destination for the Metro Phoenix area. We envisioned it to be a parking lot set up along the lakefront with lots of boats and not really geared toward RVers. But at that point we were willing to take the chance. You just never know!

We got there with only one hitch ... **Terry** didn't make a turn he should have to enter the park off the main road and we went a couple of miles beyond the entrance before we found a place where both we and Sandy could turn around. (The road we were on heads to Wickenburg, AZ, northwest of Phoenix.) So at that point, we were then following Sandy into the park. The lake itself is north of Carefree Highway and we caught glimpses of the lake as we got closer. It's a pretty large lake, manmade, of course, with both private and public marinas on its shores. We entered the park, paid our fees for a couple of nights and headed to the camping areas, following Sandy. The woman at the ranger station had given us a very confusing map, so we didn't know exactly where we were headed. We just knew that we were headed to a camping area up on a hill overlooking the lake ... we just followed Sandy as she seemed to know where she was going.

As we got closer to the lake we were impressed with what we saw, and when we got to the area we were going, we were really quite "pleasantly" surprised! It was nothing like we had thought it was going to be. In fact by the time we got situated in our sites near one another, we all decided that this was definitely the silver lining in the "cloud" of Cave Creek being full. None of us would have known that this place was so nice if we hadn't ended up there by default! It was great!

Our site was a small one (but just right for a Bambi) up a steep incline to a knoll with the front of the Bambi facing the lake. And just down the road on the other side there was a larger site that





Sandy's rig would fit into, also with a great view of the lake. This was perfect! We felt like we were the kings of the hill. One side of the hill looked north over the lake and the other side looked south into beautiful desert valleys toward Phoenix. We have since stayed on the south side of the hill facing Phoenix, and like that area of the campground as much as the lake side. Each site had a paved pad, its own covered picnic table area and a fire ring. There were also nice shower/bathroom buildings sprinkled about the loop. We had really lucked out!



We were struck with the sort of surreal scenery of desert vegetation and saguaro cacti around us with a deep blue lake in the background, complete with sail boats! We never quite got over that during our stay and it will be one of the things that sticks in our minds about our time there. It was really beautiful and totally unexpected. Sandy was particularly thrilled because she is a water person; spent a lot of time in coastal Washington state. The electric/water site area where we camped was actually one of two

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loops that sit on the crest of the hill. The loop we were in primarily looked out northward onto the lake, but from the higher sites (like ours) both sides of the hill could be seen. The other loop was mostly on the valley side of the hill, with some of the lower sites having a peek of the lake as well, around the lower end of the hill. Because of where these loops sat relative to the lake and the valleys, there was a good breeze in the early mornings. But by 10:30 or 11:00 AM the breezes calmed down and gentle breezes set in for the rest of the day. The host sites were great ... each was equipped with a "port" that the hosts' RV could be parked under to protect it a bit from the summer sun and heat. Of course, at this time of year, the temps we not too extreme so the days were pleasant in the 70s and the nights were in the 40s/50s.


The first evening we were at Lake Pleasant (Tuesday) we reveled in the views from our sites and enjoyed an evening with a yummy chef's salad in the Bambi — a combined effort between Sandy and ourselves. Sandy brought her special collection of Italian balsamic vinegars and olive oil as dressing. It was a great end to a good day. We were pleased to have found a wonderful place to camp and rest for a few days, remembering and smiling over the events of the Dead Horse Rally.

On Wednesday, after a great night's sleep, a relaxed morning and a couple of walks with the girls to further explore their new digs, we decided to do a little exploring. The first stop was the visitor's center beyond the loop where we camped. It sat at the east side of the hill facing the dam and a private marina on the opposite side of the lake. There were great views in three directions from the visitor's center. Of course, it gives a good run-down of the geology and history of the lake, as well as a great lighted relief map of the entire area to help identify various sections.

Just down from the visitor's center there was a path that led back toward our campground, and from that path another short trail took off to a small peninsula with a steep hill at the end. When the water in the lake is higher and the low "neck" of the peninsula is submerged, the peninsula will become an island, maybe 100 feet off the lakeshore. We just had to take the short hike out to the end of the peninsula and climb to the crest of the hill and sit for a bit near the couple of saguaros that were there. It was a great view of the lake and our campground sitting on the crest of the hill.

As we mentioned above, we have since been there many times, so be sure to look through our travel logs for additional visits to get a different perspective. There are both hookup (w&e) and dry camping sites, and all sites can be reserved online. There is also a dump station. We'd recommend this park in the winter, spring and fall. And if you are a boater, while the summers would be warm (hot), it's worth the trip to get to water ... a rare and welcomed thing for many of us desert dwellers ... but be sure to get an electric site so you can have AC! Enjoy!


