- (3) Size XXLarge (in both Short Sleeve and Long Sleeve) ... Add \$2 to the cost for each XXL Shirt.



Rally Report: Southern New Mexico Rally, Pancho Villa SP, Columbus, NM by Howard Efner

The Four Corners Unit of WBCCI held the second annual Fall Rally in Southern New Mexico at Pancho Villa State Park from October 22 to October 26, 2015 ... and happily, this year, mud-free! The rally, co-hosted by Terry Rich, Greg Schmuker, and Howard and Carolyn Efner, had a total of 14 Airstreams in attendance. The park, located in the Village of Columbus, NM, is on the site of Camp Furlong, which was attacked during the 1916 raid of Pancho Villa's forces. The exhibit hall and remaining historical structures help to capture the history of the raid and subsequent unsuccessful pursuit of Villa's forces in Mexico by General John "Blackjack" Pershing.

One highlight of the gathering was the Saturday morning car show held in the Exhibit Hall/Park Office parking lot. There were about 50 vehicles entered and they varied from "Rat Rods" to Vintage/ Classic/Antique automobiles, along with several motorcycles and two three wheel motorcycles which looked more like aircraft without the wings. There were three 1951 Hudson Hornets parked side-byside - have not seen that in a long time. It was a walk down memory lane for most of us for sure!



2014 Onyx Airstream 27FB

Our 2014 27FB Onyx is number 31 of the 136 made. With a move to South Dakota it was necessary for us to leave the Airstream in Prescott, where it is currently housed. We only have about 3,500 miles on it but are not planning more camper travel because of the move. This was our second Airstream, so we hate to put our camping on the shelf, but want someone else to enjoy our really fabulous Onyx.

We made a number of upgrades even though the Onyx is an Airstream on steroids. They include two 160W solar panels, an upgraded 2,000W inverter, roof mounted TV dish, awnings on the driver's side & the rear, & a weight distribution system that is a jewel. We have a number of other outfitting items that we'll leave on board.


We also have a mounted rear view camera on the Onyx. The monitor operates remotely by simply plugging it in to the 12V plug in the cab of a car or truck. Although many think it is a great back up camera (and it is), I think it is particularly good as a safety camera for on-road travel.

From the feedback we are receiving in South Dakota and Wyoming, there's a lot of interest in Airstream's ability to be a four-season camper. Our 27FB Onyx not only has the upgraded HVAC but the added 320W of solar power for added boon docking - or getting stranded in the winter. In case that happens, the added TV dish (auto channel seeking) means the occupants have something to do while the weather clears, with the added security of solar power. So the story is, Airstream as Airstream owners know is not season-limited and that is particularly so with Ricky, as we call our Onyx. Contacts we've received indicate that the notion of the Onyx as a collector's Airstream is just now being understood and the importance of only 136 models ever having been made (or possibly ever will be made) is of growing importance. Good time to upgrade to an Onyx or let friends know so they can join in the satisfaction, and fun, of an Airstream.

Roper Lake State Park A Well-Kept Secret in Arizona Camping Travel Log & Photos by Terry Rich & Greg Schmuker




This travel log entry will be a bit different than those in the past... After the rally at Pancho Villa State Park in Columbus, NM in late October, we decided to stop for a night at **Roper Lake State**Park about 6 miles south of Safford, AZ. It's about 30 miles north of I-10 on US 191. We have not been there for some time ... and the last time we were, the lake was very low, and the park felt very

"sad" in comparison to earlier visits. This time, however, the lake was much higher, and it looked better all the way around. The lake level was high, the rushes were growing well, the birds were doing their bird things, and the mountain in the distance sparkled. We were very pleased to see the lake looking as we remembered if from earlier times.

As mentioned, we have been to Roper Lake many times at varying times of year ... but fall seems to be especially pretty there ... the air is crisp, making the evening great for campfires, the nights good for sleeping ... yet the days warm enough to take walks and short hikes around the park. It is very "fall-ish" there with the trees turning and the Island peninsula to roam. We invite you to visit our travel log website and sample our visit there over the years ... 
Roper Lake for Thanksgiving A Meandering Tour of Southern Arizona Roper Lake State Park On the Road Again: Roper Lake State Park

Many things have remained the same at Roper: The roads and campsite pads are paved and well kept. There is a large area for dry camping that can also be reserved for group events ... and there are even cabins available for your non-RV friends to make use of. There are two large loops offering electric and water sites with modern rest rooms and showers. There is a




hot-spring-fed soaking tub ... which, happily, has been updated and upgraded from the earlier years. Birding, fishing, picnicking, canoeing, kayaking, and small boating remain popular draws for the park, and there's even a beach for swimming!

Some things have changed over the years. You can now make reservations, which wasn't the case when we first began going there ... but of course, rates have increased to the more or less standard AZ State Park \$25/night ...one of the less popular changes from the good ol' days.











The sites in Hacienda Loop have been redone recently ... they are more level and some of the sites that were very deep have been shortened ... but are still plenty roomy. **Dankworth Pond**, a sub-unit of the park located 3 miles to the south, is now renovated and re-opened as well. Both Roper Lake and Dankworth Pond were part of a fish hatchery system earlier, and fishing in both remain major attractions ... both are stocked with bass, crappie, bluegill, catfish, and trout.

Other area attractions include pecan groves and a winery in Bowie, AZ to the south near I-10, and Mt. Graham, the highest peak in Southern Arizona. There are National Forest Service campgrounds on Mt. Graham, too ... and the mountain is spotted with historical areas. Unfortunately, access is a bit of a white-knuckle experience. We have been up to the first campground — once, sans trailer — and have not wanted to venture further. Others may be more adventurous. It's too bad because Mt. Graham could provide relief in our summers.

The pictures here are from our most recent stop there in October, but you can see many photos from earlier visits on our **travel log**. We recommend Roper Lake as not only a destination, but as a pleasant stop-over between central and southern AZ areas to SoNM.
