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

By the way, Maria is going to represent the 4CU as our Delegate at the International Rally in Escanaba in July and Ed Stroetz (Thomson, GA) will be our Alternate Delegate! Thanks, Maria and Ed!

For the last several years **Britt Quisenberry** (Albuquerque, NM) has volunteered his time, sweat and travel to be involved with the Congo Water Project under the auspices of the non-profit organization Congo Projects for Relief

https://www.congoprojectsforrelief.org/clean-water-project.

Britt has been there several times and is scheduled for more trips in the future. The Congo Water Project is focused on building a fresh water system in the village of Musumba in the Democratic Republic of Congo. In short, a 75 meter deep well has been drilled and a high capacity pump to lift the water has been installed. The water will be stored in a 500,000 liter tank and then with the aid of a booster pump it will be delivered through the village as safe, pressurized

drinking water. The current water system is 60 years old and relies on a stream uphill to gravity feed two storage tanks and then gravity feed the village. Thus, in a dry year they have little to no water. Unlike most water projects in Africa where shallow wells are dug and often run dry and collapse, this is much more like a municipal water supply. It can be treated and sanitized if needed and it will supply the village of 45,000 people. In the future, we hope to install another well and tank, including a new pressure loop through the village to aid in getting water to the far edges of the village. This plan also includes a solar field to supply electricity to the pumps.

Britt gave an informational talk to the Moab Rally to explain the project, what it means to the village and to relate his personal involvement. As it happens,

after the dust settled, we had a little extra cash from the Moab rally fees collected, so we are making a onetime donation to the project on behalf of the 4CU. If you would like to contribute to the project, please contact Britt at bqinabq@gmail.com. Thanks, Britt, for your involvement in this worthwhile effort!



AIRSTREAMING IN NORTHERN NEW MEXICO

In the March Newsletter we focused on Southern New Mexico. This time we will look at Northern New Mexico. There are a LOT of camping opportunities between the very well developed NM State Park system, national forests, and other federal lands. We haven't been to every New Mexico State Park but we hope to camp in them all eventually.

For general information go to the New Mexico State Parks at http://www.emnrd.state.nm.us/SPD/.

For general information go to the New Mexico State Parks. The NM State Park Locater (http://www.emnrd.state.nm.us/SPD/FindaPark.html) Page on the site is a handy reference to bookmark for future reference. You can jump to any park from it. The Fees, Permit and Rentals Page spells out the fee structure. Generally,

primitive campsites are \$8/night; campsites with water & electricity in NM State Parks are \$14/night, and if sewer hookups are available those go for \$18/night. Compared to AZ State Park fees which range from \$15 - \$35/night ... these are great prices! For NM State residents there is a yearly camping pass available for \$180, or \$100 for 62+ seniors. The passes reduce the costs to a handsome \$4/night for W&E and \$8/night with W&E&S. Can't beat that! Unfortunately, the annual pass for non-NM-residents is \$225/year ... so if you camp more than 16 nights (based on \$14/night), it's worth the fee. Sadly, there is no senior pass for out-of-staters.

We have camped in several of the Northern NM parks but there are several more we have yet to see.

We consider Heron Lake State Park to be one of our favorites...it's northwest of Espanola, NM near Ojos, NM just south of Chama. It's a great area to explore and El Vado Lake State Park is next door. We know that several of our members enjoy Heron Lake when passing through that area, and we have even had a couple of rallies there! (We should do that again, yes?!) The park is large, has a nice mix of pine and cedar trees ... the lake has good fishing (on ice in the winter!), and there are campgrounds with water & electricity as well as dry camping opportunities meaning something for everyone.

After one of our Santa Fe rallies, we explored a few

state parks in northeast and east-central NM...the first was Villanueva Stare Park east of Santa Fe. It's a nice little park tucked away in a small canyon. It's very quiet and a good place to relax and settle in with a good book.

From Villanueva, we headed south to pick up I-40 and head east to Santa Rosa Lake State Park. It's a "reservoir campground" so it was pretty far from the water and seemed to be populated by locals (some looked semi-permanent) ... after all it is the only body of open water for miles in any direction.

It was fairly warm when we were at Santa Rosa, so we decided not to stay and headed further south to Vaughn and east of US 60 to Manzano Mountains State Park. Manzano is a pleasant little campground a bit north of Mountainair, NM, in pine forest ... it's just above the scrub oak and piñon pine, so the park is not quite high enough in altitude to serve as a summer getaway, so it would be best to visit in spring and fall. The facilities were pretty new when we were there... very nicely done sites and a brand new dump station. Sites have water & electricity. The Quarai Mission Ruins are nearby, and worth a visit.

Federal Lands

We highly recommend the Jemez National Forest campgrounds NW of Albuquerque. We stayed a Jemez Falls Campground and really enjoyed it. It's high, in the pine forest and in an area with lots of see. This is where we saw a sign for Fenton Lake State Park but we couldn't add another stop on that trip. We did

> make one more stop: a small but really sweet campground on the Jemez River on the way south out of the Jemez ... it was Linda Vista Campground (dry camping) south of the town of Jemez Springs (a fun place) right on the river. It was under construction when we were there, but Bandalier

National Monument is in the Jemez Mts near White Rock, NM on Highway 4. We'll hit that the next time we are in the neighborhood. (See our travel log for additional details about this area: http://www.tbrich. com/azbambi/heron-jemez-balloon sep10 intro. html)

On another post-Santa Fe rally extended trip, we did the Enchanted Circle in NoNM. This is a scenic drive that encircles the mountains that are home to the Taos ski area. If you start in Taos and head east and north, you will pass through Shady Brook, Angel Fire (where we stayed at the Monte Verde RV Park



previously owned by 4CU members Lynn Eubank & Maria Beck), Eagles Nest (and the state park there) then north and west to the Red River area, and finally Questa and south to Arroyos Honda and back to Taos. We stayed a couple of nights at one of the several national forest campgrounds on the stretch from Red River to Questa. Very pretty area.

If you travel from Springerville, AZ to Soccoro, NM, on US 60, there is a very nice campground called Datil Wells Campground about 1 mile west of Datil, NM ... maybe 1/2 mile south of 60. It's a BLM campground, dry camping, free firewood, shelters at sites, not heavily used and just an overall nice place to stop for the night. Inexpensive, too. If memory serves, it was \$4/night with a senior pass.

We can't forget Valley of Fires Campground, a BLMoperated campground south of Socorro of I-25 between San Antonio and Carrizozo, NM. It's a wonderful little campground that sits on an "island" of terra firma in the middle of a large lava flow. It's geologically quite interesting and there is an easy paved trail through the flow to get an up-close and personal look. The campground has sweeping views of the mountains to the southeast and beautiful sunsets. The campground offers both dry camping and water/electric sites overlooking the flow. Shower and a dump station are available.



2017 MONUMENTAL MOAB RALLY REVIEW

The Monumental Moab Rally was held at the ACT Campground in Moab, UT 8–12 May 2017 ... and was it a good time!

For those who don't know the back story ... Terry & Greg enjoyed a big loop trip of national parks and monuments in Utah in May 2016 ... our last stop was Moab, which is the vortex of Utah's red rock country. We thought, "Hmm. I wonder. This would be a great place for a 4CU Rally! We NEED a rally in UT!" And it was hatched. We spoke to the staff who were all for it, and we booked the entire RV park of 20 sites for 4 nights, arriving Monday and departing Friday ... leaving a weekend at both ends for travel.

ACT Campground is a small RV park of 20 sites along with a tenting area and rooms for rent. There is s a community kitchen, outdoor kitchen, showers/

bathroom, laundry, fire pit and now a big ol' yurt for groups of up to 30 people! We had full hookups, Wifi and cable! What more can we ask for?

A good time was had by all. We filled all 20 sites and we had 3 other rigs who couldn't get into the park but stayed at nearby RV parks and joined us for events ... not ideal, but it worked. Monday evening was a happy hour mixer. Tuesday morning we had coffee with Twinkies, Ding Dongs & HoHo's (which we called "Retro Sweets") and left all four days wide open so folks could visit all the many points of interest in the area.

Tuesday evening was a Burger, Brat and Hot Dog BBQ at the outdoor kitchen and grill with all the fixin's and a ton of shared sides and deserts. After the BBQ we had a presentation from Kim, one of the ACT

Campground owners about "Desert Varnish." This is the black streaking you often see on the red rock cliffs. Now we know! Just ask us! (Thanks, Kim!)

Also Tuesday evening, Ruth Volmer, Diane Moore, Tamara Rodriguez and Bonnie Bobman had the opportunity to spend an evening with the Delicate Stitchers, the local Moab quilters and sewists. After a happy "half-hour", the girls were treated to news

about the current quilt show at the Museum of Moab and a short lecture by a teacher on a quilting technique. This was followed by a show and share of everyone's current work. The 4CUers were encouraged to bring and show their beautiful original embroidery, Airstream one of a kind Asian fiber works of art, crazyquilted denim coverlets and cherished heirloom guilts. What a wonderful evening of community in Moab! Thanks, all!

Wednesday evening we had an optional outing ... Dinner and the "Light & Sound Show" at Canyonlands By Night Tours. Dinner was a Cowboy Dutch Oven buffet dinner (which was really quite good) in their restaurant followed by a 2-hour night cruise up the Colorado River and back. The cruise included a talk by a host/guide who pointed out features in the red rock cliffs and explained some of the history and geology behind it all. Once it was dark, we were entertained with lights, music and a narrative with

more history and information about the people who lived there. The boat was an open barge-like design with rows of seats allowing great views. As the boat goes up the river and back, the cliffs are lit and story told. It was a bit chilly that night but we were prepared ...plus they gave us blankets. There were 37 in our group, plus some other folks, but we didn't fill the boat, which holds 144 people. Many have said this was the highlight of the rally, and we were so pleased

that it was well-received and that so many of us participated. Those who didn't held down the fort and minded kids and dogs.

Thursday morning the ACT Campground Staff headed by one of the owners, Cherie, and their "Artist in Residence" David (who is a writer and photographer and also mans the desk), provided us with a pancake breakfast complete with blueberry plain, and banana/walnut pancakes, ham and scrambled eggs to fortify us for the last day of sight-seeing.

That evening we had a pot luck (again a lot of great food) followed by a drawing for some goodies/prizes, a presentation about the Congo Water Project (see the Member News Notes section in the Newsletter), and stargazing, courtesy of Steve & Cindy MacKenzie, who brought their telescope.

Friday morning was departure time. Four of us had planned to stay an additional night just to decompress.

That was a good thing, but was a little sad to see all the Aluminum leave and be replaced by big while boxes of various types. It was a complete change-over and the park was again filled to capacity by the end of the afternoon. (Greg and Terry had witnessed this change-over take place in the reverse when we got there a day early on Sunday and watched Monday AM as all the big boxes left to be replaced with Aluminum! THAT was not sad!)

We want to thank everyone who attended the rally and helped make it a success. It was a great group and a wonderful mix of members ... we had several there for the their very first rally, as well as a good number of familiar faces. There was much hugging. We even gained 1 new Affiliate ... some folks from UT who happened by.

We also want to thank the ACT staff. They were incredible. More than once we heard members commenting about how wonderful the staff was and how much they enjoyed not only the facility they have built but also the friendly environment they have created.

ACT owners Kim & Cherie have a 2006 19' Bambi just like ours... it's parked in a permanent site near the office and they rent it out like a room. Being Airstream owners we told them they ought to join our merry little band of campers! Cherie said they didn't have much opportunity to get out and camp, but I reminded them that when they close down in the winter, it would be a good time to escape south to warmer temps. So they may be 4CUers before long! Bonus!
